hen Kathleen was 4 years old, her father was killed in the Vietnam War. Her mom had one piece of resounding advice for Kathleen and her two sisters: Stay away from military men.



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The couple went on to officer and candidate school together, and he proposed at the end of training. In 1994, they married and later had two boys — one of whom joined the Army when he was 19 and is now in the National Guard deployed to Qatar.

Kathleen's sidestep to real estate came from personal experience. "We owned a condo, and we were buying a house. I thought I could sell it myself, so I made a website and a brochure, then it sold very quickly."

"I didn't know anything about selling on my own, but I enjoyed it and wanted to get my license," she said. Now 20 years later, Kathleen says she hasn't looked back.

She credits her success to her strong communication skills.

"One of the most important things in the Army is communication. It's huge — you have to do 360-degree communications to the folks that you report to, command to, and stand next to."

It was a bumpy start: "There's an expression in real estate that being a real estate agent lends itself to unlimited income potential and flexible hours, but in the beginning, it's the opposite — unlimited hours and flexible income potential."

In no time, though, her regimented perseverance sparked a stellar career. With dozens of sales under her belt at two different brokerages in 2010, Kathleen had gathered the confidence to go out on her own. So she started KKeegan Realty.

"It was scary getting started with my own systems, but I can make my own decisions, and I don't have a corporate mindset. Everything and everyone is different, and I can work with them that way on that."


Having thrived for more than a decade with dedicated support staff and attracting additional agents, KKeegan Realty is just another mark of Kathleen's dedication to success.
